# **10.5** Divide and Conquer

## Divide and Conquer Paradigm

Divide and Conquer is a common and useful type of recursion

#### Approach

- Break problem instance into smaller instances divide step
- Recursively solve problem on smaller instances
- Ombine solutions to smaller instances to obtain a solution to the original instance
  - conquer step

#### Question: Why is this not plain recursion?

- In divide and conquer, each smaller instance is typically at least a constant factor smaller than the original instance which leads to efficient running times.
- There are many examples of this particular type of recursion that it deserves its own treatment.

## Divide and Conquer Paradigm

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#### Approach

- Break problem instance into smaller instances divide step
- Recursively solve problem on smaller instances
- **③** Combine solutions to smaller instances to obtain a solution to the original instance
  - conquer step
